Harvard Geospatial Library Additions

The Harvard Geospatial Library (HGL) has added 22 layers representing historic U.S. county boundaries and county populations for each decade from 1790 until 2000. The data was produced by the University of Minnesota's Population Center as part of the National Historic GIS (NHGIS) project. The datasets residing in the HGL represent what were originally two separate NHGIS files that were aggregated/joined by the CGA in order to make the county and population data more user-friendly in a GIS environment. In addition, over 200 layers containing United States demographic and marketing statistics from 1995 have been added. The statistics are presented with ZIP-code boundaries and U.S. Census Tract boundaries for each U.S. state and the District of Columbia, and is presented at county and state level for a few nation-wide datasets. The data was derived from MaconUSA's DVD set called 'Maps and Data for Microsoft Office 95', published in 1996, and was converted from MapInfo tab format to ESRI shapefile format in order to make it more accessible.
