Members of the greater Boston community (and beyond) interested in GIS are welcome to attend. If you have a specific research question and would like to understand how using WorldMap can provide you a way of publishing your data, you are most welcome to attend. If you have data, you will be provided with one-on-one training as to how to present the data on WorldMap.

For this spring semester, the WorldMap Collaborative will meet every Monday evening at 5 PM in room K031 (Concourse level) of the CGIS Knafel Building at 1737 Cambridge Street. The room is on your right just before you enter the HMDC lab (see this map).

If you have a specific WorldMap question, regardless of the meeting time, you may contact Jeff Howry (jhowry@fas.harvard.edu), who will be hosting each workshop. K031 is a multimedia room, so you are welcome to join us to observe other presentations, as well as learn about the features of the WorldMap platform. Please take a few moments to explore WorldMap (http://worldmap.harvard.edu) and learn why more than 300,000 people have visited WorldMap (more than 1,000 per day) from every country in the world!
