WorldMap (http://worldmap.harvard.edu) is pleased to announce a new cartographic tool called "Classify" for building complex map symbolizations. The tool allows a researcher to select map variables (such as census values) and quickly render new visualizations of their data. The user can choose the number of categories to be generated, the colors used, and the

classification technique employed. Classification methods include: Unique Values, Quantile, Equal Interval, and Jenks Natural Breaks. This capability was funded by the Radcliffe Institute for Advanced Study (http://www.bostonarearesearchinitiative.net).
